This has reference to your online proposal no. IA/TN/CRZ/564361/2026 dated 29/01/2026 on the above-mentioned project proposal for CRZ Clearance, in accordance with the provisions of the Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ) Notification, 2011 and as amended thereof issued under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

2. The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has examined the proposal for ‘Development of Nandavanam Heritage Park at Survey No 94/1B and 350, Tiruvidanthai Village, Thiruporur Taluk, Chengalpattu District under Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI) Scheme by M/s Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation, Chennai, Tamil Nadu’.

3. The proposal was considered by the Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC) for Infrastructure Development, Coastal Regulation Zone, Building/Construction and Miscellaneous projects, in its 437th meeting held on 27/02/2026. The Project Proponent (M/s Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation) and Consultant (M/s ABC Techno Labs India Private Limited) have made a presentation on above said proposal and informed the following salient features of the proposal, including the details provided in the application of the project to EAC:

4. The Committee deliberated on the proposal based on the information submitted and the presentation made by the Project Proponent (PP). During the deliberations, the PP informed that the proposed Nandavanam Heritage Park is envisaged as a public recreational facility comprising landscaped gardens, playfields, and other utility infrastructure intended for public use. The project site falls within CRZ-IB, CRZ-III (No Development Zone – NDZ), and CRZ-III (200–500 m) categories. However, the PP clarified that all proposed development activities are confined to CRZ-III (NDZ) and CRZ-III (200–500 m) areas, and that no development activities are proposed within the CRZ-IB area. The total project area is 2,76,614.9 sq.m. (68.35 acres), out of which the total proposed built-up area is 3,202 sq.m (0.79 acres). It was further clarified that all permanent construction activities are restricted to the CRZ-III (200–500 m) zone, and no concrete or permanent structures are proposed within the CRZ-III (NDZ). Upon detailed examination, the Committee observed that the proposed activities are permissible under the provisions of the CRZ Notification, 2011, and that the proposal has been duly recommended by the Tamil Nadu Coastal Zone Management Authority (TNCZMA). The Committee, however, emphasized that no concrete structure shall be established in CRZ-III (NDZ) and robust environmental

safeguards must be implemented during the construction and operation phase of the project. The PP was directed to adopt comprehensive measures under the Environmental Management Plan (EMP) to ensure protection of adjacent coastal waters and to prevent any adverse impacts on ecological health. The Committee stressed that the highest standards of precaution and safety must be maintained during both construction and operational phases. Appropriate Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) shall be developed and implemented to ensure public safety and promote responsible, eco-friendly practices within the CRZ areas. Utmost care shall be taken to prevent dumping of solid waste and discharge of wastewater into coastal waters. The Committee underscored that all applicable safety norms and statutory clearances related to the development of such recreational facilities must be obtained prior to commencement of work. Further, all mitigation measures prescribed in the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Report, EMP, and Disaster Management Plan (DMP) shall be implemented in letter and spirit, without deviation. The Committee opined that there should not be any boundary wall on seaward side of the project along the coast and advised the development of a thick 10-15 meters wide green belt of suitable endemic, salt tolerant species along the seaward side of the project area, parallel to the coastline, across the entire project stretch. This measure is intended to enhance ecological buffering and safeguard the proposed infrastructure from high sea winds and other natural calamities such as cyclones. Additionally, the Committee opined that a comprehensive SOP should be put in place to ensure adequate safety arrangements within the heritage park premises, including the deployment of trained lifeguards to protect visitors and maintain safety standards. It was further directed that all lighting within the project site shall strictly conform to applicable coastal and environmental norms so as to avoid disturbance to marine life, including sea turtles and associated coastal flora and fauna. In response, the PP assured the Committee of full compliance with all the conditions and commitments stipulated above and submitted a written undertaking *vide* email dated 27/02/2026. The same was examined and found satisfactory while approving the minutes of the meeting.

5. The Committee, after detailed deliberations and considering the submissions made by the project proponent, has recommended the proposal for CRZ Clearance as per CRZ Notification, 2011, subject to terms and conditions as stipulated during its 437st meeting held on 27/02/2026.

6. Based on the recommendation of the Tamil Nadu State Coastal Zone Management Authority (TNSCZMA) and considering the submissions made by the project proponent, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, in acceptance of the recommendations of the Expert Appraisal Committee (CRZ), hereby accords CRZ Clearance to the project for **“Development of Nandavanam Heritage Park at Survey No 94/1B and 350, Tiruvidanthai Village, Thiruporur Taluk, Chengalpattu District under Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI) Scheme by M/s Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation, Chennai, Tamil Nadu”** under the provisions of the CRZ Notification, 2011 and amendments thereto, subject to the compliance of terms and conditions as under:-

Specific Conditions

S. No	Specific Conditions
1	All construction activities must strictly adhere to the provisions of the CRZ Notification, 2011, as amended from time to time.

2	No activities other than the proposed development of gardens, parks, and playfields and approach road shall be permitted in CRZ-III (NDZ). For the proposed activities in CRZ-III (NDZ), concrete blocks shall not be used/ no concrete structures shall be constructed and only eco-friendly construction materials must be utilized.
3	There should not be any boundary wall on the seaward side of the project along the coast. Instead a thick 10-15 meters wide green belt of suitable endemic, salt tolerant species shall be developed along the seaward side of the project area, parallel to the coastline, across the entire project stretch. This measure is intended to enhance ecological buffering and safeguard the proposed infrastructure from high sea winds and other natural calamities such as cyclones.
4	In CRZ-III (200-500m) zones, all construction activities must strictly adhere to the guidelines stipulated in Annexure-III of the CRZ Notification, 2011.
5	As committed, solar / solar hybrid street lights in open areas, pathways & parking and Solar water heating shall be established to meet the 25% of the total energy requirement.
6	As committed, rainwater-harvesting facilities should be implemented in the project premises as per extant norms.
7	As committed, 100 KLD STP should be established and treated water to be reused for greenbelt & landscaping and flushing purposes.
8	As committed, no untreated sewage and wastewater should not be discharged to adjacent areas/water bodies and is recycled within the premises as per the extant norms as applicable.
9	As committed, a bio-shield/windbreak of appropriate width (at least 5-10 meters wide) using native species shall be established in the NDZ area on the seaward side parallel to the coast on the entire length of the project site.
10	All mitigation measures outlined in the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Report, as well as those specified in the Environmental Management Plan (EMP) and Disaster Management Plan (DMP), shall be implemented in letter and spirit, without any deviation.
11	As committed, a comprehensive SOP should be put in place to ensure adequate safety arrangements within the heritage park premises, including the deployment of trained lifeguards to protect visitors and maintain safety standards.
12	As committed, all lighting within the project site shall strictly conform to applicable coastal and environmental norms so as to avoid disturbance to marine life, including sea turtles and associated coastal flora and fauna.
13	Any temporary physical infrastructure setup and excavated material during the construction of the project shall not be dumped in water bodies or adjacent areas.

14	Construction material and structures/scaffoldings erected for construction at site shall be cleared immediately after finishing construction and it shall be ensured that no construction waste, garbage and machinery or equipment are left post construction.
15	No groundwater shall be extracted to meet with the water requirements during the construction and/or operation phases.
16	Permanent labour camp, machinery and material storage shall not be set up in the CRZ area.
17	Topsoil excavated during construction activities shall be stored for use in horticulture/landscape development etc. within the project site.
18	The Project Proponent shall comply with order / direction, if any, issued by Hon'ble Court/tribunal on the project.
19	All the conditions stipulated by Tamil Nadu Coastal Zone Management Authority (TNCZMA) under CRZ Notification 2011, <i>vide</i> letter No. P1/DOECC/136/2026, dated 12/02/2026 and commitments made by the PP before the TNCZMA and EAC shall be followed in letter and spirit.
20	All necessary clearance from the concerned authority, as may be applicable should be obtained prior to commencement of project or activity.

1	Management of solid waste in accordance with the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 shall be strictly implemented.
2	'Consent to Establish' and /or 'Consent to Operate' shall be obtained from State Pollution Control Board under the provisions of Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and / or the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, as may be applicable.
3	Disposal of muck during construction phase should not create any adverse effect on the neighbouring communities and be disposed taking the necessary precautions for general safety and health aspects of people, only in approved sites with the approval of Competent Authority.
4	All liquid waste arising from the proposed development will be disposed of as per the norms prescribed by Central / State Pollution Control Board. There shall not be any disposal of untreated effluent into the sea / coastal water bodies. It shall be ensured that the wastewater generated is treated in the STP as committed by the project proponent. The treated waste water shall be reused for landscaping, flushing and / or HVAC cooling purposes etc. within

	the development. The project proponent should also make alternate arrangement for situation arising due to malfunctioning of STP. There shall be regular monitoring of standard parameters of the effluent discharge from STP under intimation to the SPCB.
5	Any hazardous waste generated during construction phase, shall be disposed off as per applicable rules and norms with necessary approvals of the State Pollution Control Board.
6	A copy of the clearance letter shall be uploaded on the website of the concerned State Coastal Zone Management Authority/State Pollution Control Board. The Clearance letter shall also be displayed at the Regional Office, District Industries Centre and Collector's Office/ Tehsildar's office for 30 days.
7	A six-monthly monitoring report shall need to be submitted by the project proponent to the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry regarding the implementation of the stipulated conditions.
8	The Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change or any other Competent Authority may stipulate any additional conditions or modify the existing ones, if necessary in the interest of environment and the same shall be complied with.
9	Full co-operation shall be extended to the officials from the Regional Office of MoEF&CC, during monitoring of implementation of environmental safeguards stipulated. It shall be ensured that documents/data sought pertinent is made available to the monitoring team. A complete set of all the documents submitted to MoEF&CC shall be forwarded to the concerned Regional Office of MoEF&CC.
10	In the case of any change(s) in the scope of the project, the project would require a fresh appraisal by this Ministry.
11	The Ministry reserves the right to add additional safeguard measures subsequently, if considered necessary, and to take action to ensure effective implementation of the suggested safeguard measures in a time bound and satisfactory manner, including revoking of the environment clearance under the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, for non-compliance.
12	All other statutory clearances such as the approvals for storage of diesel from Chief Controller of Explosives, Fire Department, Civil Aviation Department, Forest Conservation Act, 1980 and Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 etc. shall be obtained, as applicable by project proponent from the respective Competent Authorities.
13	The project proponent should advertise in at least two local Newspapers widely circulated in the region, one of which shall be in the vernacular language informing that the project has been accorded CRZ Clearance and copies of clearance letters are available with the State Pollution Control Board (SPCB) and may also be seen on the website of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change at https://parivesh.nic.in/ . The advertisement should be made within Seven days from the date of receipt of the Clearance letter and a copy

	of the same should be forwarded to the concerned Regional Office of this Ministry.
14	A copy of the clearance letter shall be sent by the proponent to concerned Panchayat, Zilla Parishad/Municipal Corporation, Urban Local Body and the Local NGO, if any, from whom suggestions/ representations, if any, were received while processing the proposal.
15	The proponent shall upload the status of compliance of the stipulated conditions, including results of monitored data on their website and shall update the same periodically. It shall simultaneously be sent to the Regional Office of MoEF&CC, the respective Zonal Office of CPCB and the SPCB.
16	The environmental statement for each financial year ending 31st March in Form-V as is mandated to be submitted by the project proponent to the concerned State Pollution Control Board as prescribed under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986, as amended subsequently, shall also be put on the website of the project proponent along with the status of compliance of clearance conditions and shall also be sent to the respective Regional Office of the Ministry by e-mail.

7. This Clearance is subject to final order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the matter of Goa Foundation Vs Union of India in Writ Petition (Civil) No.460 of 2004 as may be applicable to this project.

8. The Ministry reserves the right to stipulate additional conditions, if found necessary at subsequent stages and the project proponent shall implement all the said conditions in a time bound manner. The Ministry may revoke or suspend the CRZ clearance, if implementation of any of the above conditions is not found satisfactory.

9. Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated data and failure to comply with any of the conditions mentioned above may result in withdrawal of this clearance and attract action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

10. Any appeal against this CRZ clearance shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.

11. The above conditions shall be enforced, *inter-alia* under the provisions of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, Hazardous and Other Wastes (Management and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016 and the Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991 along with their amendments and Rules and any other orders passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/High Courts and any other Court of Law relating to the subject matter.

12. This issues with approval of the Competent Authority.
